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analyzed more than 760,000 email threats targeting 40 of the world's largest brands and found that nearly half of all email threats spoofed the brand in the display name.

Here's how it works: If a fraudster wanted to spoof the hypothetical brand "My Bank," the email may look something like:

> To: You <you@yourdomain.com> From: My Bank <accounts@secure.com> ← Subject: Unauthorized login attempt

Since My Bank doesn't own the domain "secure.com," DMARC will not block this email on My Bank's behalf, even if My Bank has set their DMARC policy for mybank.com to reject messages that fail to authenticate. This fraudulent email, once delivered,



appears legitimate because most user inboxes only present the display name. Don't trust the display name. Check the email address in the header from—if looks suspicious, don't open the email.

Tip **2:** Look but don't click

Hover your mouse over any links embedded in the body of the email. If the link address looks weird, don't click on it. If you want to test the link, open a new window and type in website address directly rather than clicking on the link from unsolicited emails.

10 Tips on How to Identify a Phishing or Spoofing Email

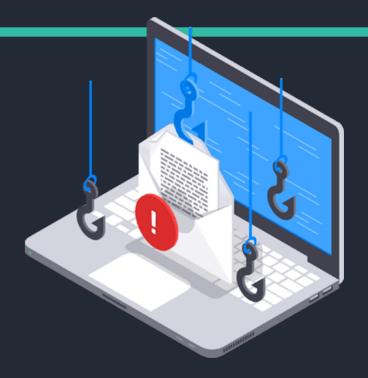
Phishing attacks are more rampant than ever before, rising by more than 162 percent from 2010 to 2014. They cost organizations around the globe \$4.5 billion every year and over half of internet users get at least one phishing email per day.

The best defense companies have against phishing attacks is to block malicious emails before they reach customers with the DMARC (Domain-based Message Authentication Reporting and Conformance) standard. Brands must also work with a vendor that can offer email threat intelligence data revealing attacks beyond DMARC (e.g., attacks that spoof their brand using domains outside of the company's control). Unfortunately, no matter what companies do, some phishing emails will always make it to the inbox. And those messages are extremely effective – 97% of people around the globe cannot identify a sophisticated phishing email. That's where customer education comes in.

Here are 10 tips on how to identify a phishing or spoofing email. Share them externally with your customers and internally with your company.

Tip 🚺 Don't trust the display name

A favorite phishing tactic among cybercriminals is to spoof the display name of an email. Return Path



Tip **5:** Check for spelling mistakes

Brands are pretty serious about email. Legitimate messages usually do not have major spelling mistakes or poor grammar. Read your emails carefully and report anything that seems suspicious.

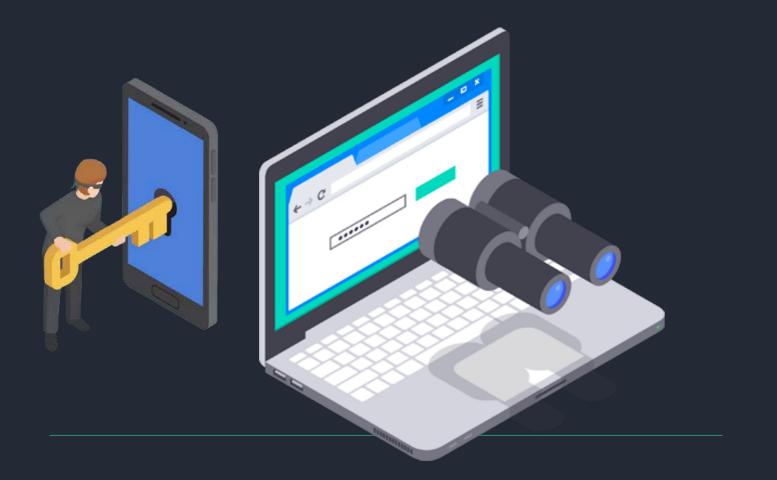
Tip **4**: Analyze the salutation

Is the email addressed to a vague "Valued Customer?" If so, watch out–legitimate businesses will often use a personal salutation with your first and last name.

Tip **5:** Don't give up personal information

Legitimate banks and most other companies will never ask for personal credentials via email. Don't give them up.





Tip **6**: Beware of urgent or threatening language in the subject line

Invoking a sense of urgency or fear is a common phishing tactic. Beware of subject lines that claim your "account has been suspended" or your account had an "unauthorized login attempt."

Tip **7**: Review the signature

Lack of details about the signer or how you can contact a company strongly suggests a phish. Legitimate businesses always provide contact details.

Don't click on attachments Tip 💽

Including malicious attachments that contain viruses and malware is a common phishing tactic. Malware can damage files on your computer, steal your passwords or spy on you without your knowledge. Don't open any email attachments you weren't expecting.

Tip 🤩 Don't trust the header from email address

Fraudsters not only spoof brands in the display name, but also spoof brands in the header from email address. Return Path found that nearly 30% of more than 760,000 email threats spoofed brands somewhere in the header from email address with more than two thirds spoofing the brand in the email domain alone.

Tip **10:** Don't believe everything you see

Phishers are extremely good at what they do. Just because an email has convincing brand logos, language, and a seemingly valid email address, does not mean that it's legitimate. Be skeptical when it comes to your email messages--if it looks even remotely suspicious, don't open it.

The risk of fraud in organisations has dramatically increased in recent times due to the pressures caused by the financial crisis. The impact of fraud is detrimental Dear X2 Colleagues,

We strongly urge all members of X2 to follow our lead in not only protecting the network but protecting your own company against bad debtors and fraudulent companies. By taking simple steps of either checking the company profile on the website, checking the expiry dates or by contacting X2 Membership Services, all of this can be avoided. To add on to the above problems, we are also

seeing a significant increase in email scams. Please check every mail thoroughly before making payment or responding with private details. Fraud detection and prevention may seem like a difficult process but using the information given in the image below for guidance, every company can take steps and measures in order to reduce the possibility of being a victim of fraud.

As recent corporate incidents have shown, financial losses arising from fraudulent activity may lead to redundancies, factory closures, and the loss of business opportunities, or even business failure.

USEFUL TIPS

Check the order thoroughly

Match information from debtor's website with that of the public space.

Pay attention to

• Whether the company is associated with a bankrupt business.

• Whether the responsible person is associated with the bankrupt business.

Email

• Pay special attention to the email address domain.

• Professional companies would not use domains such as @microsoft.com or free email accounts like Yahoo, Gmail & Hotmail.

- Copy the domain of the email address to your browser and check the webpage.
- Check the email headers to find out in which country the email server is located.

• A company operating in Germany generally does not use email servers in China.

Company's website

• Check if the contact data matches the data provided in the public space.

Quite often fraudsters use details of an actual company and change just the telephone numbers.

• Structure and contents of the website: when constructing a scam website, fraudsters aim at creating the first impression, while the rest of the information contained in pages other than the home page is typically of a low standard.

• Website creation date: generally, websites created by fraudsters are new and have been online for a short period of time.

Credit reports

If you are interested in business dealings with the potential partner, be sure to apply to companies providing credit reports. There, you will see the legal status, sphere of activities and financial indicators of the company.

Check-up call

Call other telephone numbers other than those indicated in the email, contract or website. Try to find the telephone numbers of other employees of the company on the internet and call them. It may turn out that nobody in the company knows the author of the offer.

Such information might not prove relevant to you, and you might not have enough time to deal with it. However, you should remember that you are the only one that can protect your business against possible losses. All the provided tips are merely recommendations, and if one of the items matches, this does not yet mean that you have encountered a dishonest customer. The more information you have, the more evidence you have to protect your company.

X2 Logistics Networks Members **AGX Logistics & Knot Global**

AGX and Knot Global Japan found themselves cooperating on a critical AOG logistics shipment just days after meeting at the X2 Conference in Hua Hin, Thailand when an aircraft was forced to emergency land on the island of Okinawa while en route from Kuala Lumpur to Honolulu.

On 27 February a large commercial airliner carrying 379 passengers destined for Honolulu, Hawaii was grounded at Naha Airport on the Japanese island of Okinawa due to an engine failure and was in urgent need of AOG logistics services. Not long after departing Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia the airplane's captain received indications of problems with the right engine. With the safety of the passengers as the main concern the captain shut down the engine and declared an emergency landing. The aircraft was directed to Okinawa's Naha Airport where it landed safely without any injuries to passengers or crew.

At 04:00AM the same day, the AGX AOG desk received a call just 1 hour and 45 minutes after the engine indicated trouble and an in flight shut down was performed. After receiving the call the AGX Team was tasked with delivering a 40,000 kilogram Trent 700 aircraft engine with tooling and equipment to Naha, Japan.

Within 4 hours AGX chartered an IL-76 aircraft but also needed to acquire the necessary permissions and requirements for clearance. This is where fellow X2 Logistics Networks member Knot Global contributed to the successful transport of the needed engine.

The typical clearance time for acquiring permission to land at a Japanese airport is 10 days, but AGX, with the help of Knot Global Japan CEO Takamitsu Matsuzawa, clearance was acquired and the IL-76 aircraft carrying the engine was cleared for landing on 01 March, just 2 days later.



Although, Mr. Matsuzawa originally planned to travel from the site of the Annual X2 Conference in Hua Hin, Thailand to home in Tokyo, Japan; he instead changed his travel plans and flew directly to Naha to personally handle the charter clearance for the IL-76.

In the end the combination of AGX's expertise in producing unique critical AOG solutions and the ability of Knot Global to be directly involved in supporting with local authorities allowed for the implementation of the fastest and most secure option. The Trent 700 engine was handed over to engineers at Naha Airport and within hours the aircraft was back in the sky. 🕅

Upon arrival of the barge at Jebel Ali, FLS coordinated with the port, customs officials and shipping line to load the 57 ton gantry on to 2 Flat Rack containers for stowage. The port gantry crane was used to load the side gantry on to the container ship. The shipment is currently en-route to Rotterdam.

France To Iran By EAS

X2 Critical member EAS recently helped a French customer organize a shipment of automotive parts from France to Iran.

The last minute charter was called for 25 tons of premium freight. To ensure the job was done properly, EAS was hands on for the entire process, including accompanying the packer to the customer located 200 kilometers out of Paris.

After properly packing the cargo was brought to the awaiting charter flight and flown out as quickly as possible to Iran where the automotive parts were successfully received. destination port of Mombasa, Kenya.

Fleet Line Shipping'vs project operations team coordinated well with Jebel Ali port, local customs, and the vessel operator. The job was well executed with the placement of four 40 foot empty Flat Rack containers on board the container ship and then the cargo was loaded by shore crane.

The shipment concluded with a successful discharge at the Kenyan port of Mombasa in a record 9 days time from pick up date.





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X2 Members Jet8 (Thailand) and AGX -**AOG Cooperation**

Thailand X2 Logistics Networks member Jet8 and Malaysian member AGX handled an AOG shipment together from Malaysia to Thailand. The two companies worked together to move a critical AOG shipment of aircraft wings via air from Malaysia to Chonburi, Thailand. Overall the shipment was a rather routine

and there weren't any remarkable challenges and all went smoothly on both sides of the shipment. When asked for comment, the team at Jet8 simply stated, "We're proud to work as a team with members of the network like AGX." Another successful X2 Logistics Networks shipment!

I have one thing I would like to bring up for my very good friend Mounir from Aubertrans! He helped me to get medical supplies to a hospital in Sao Paulo within the deadline. They were needed urgently.

We had 85 cbm of medical supplies!

The supplier was 500km from Paris and we had to get it on the next possible direct flight to Sao Paulo!

Due to urgency and the difficulty in collecting the goods in France, we wanted to communicate perfectly with the supplier so we asked our Friends from Aubertrans for help to cover the documents, organize the collection and bring it in time to the airline in Luxembourg!

Due to very strict customs rules and document requirements we needed to use someone who we trust as the shipment could be stuck in customs for days because of any small mistake. If the happened the medical supplies will arrive too late!

Without hesitation Mounir (Managing Director, Aubertrans) jumped in his car personally, drove 500km for us and fixed all documents, labelling and controlled truck loading!

He was reachable all day and late afternoon to keep us aware of everything!

The whole shipment departed within 2 days to Sao Paulo and was ready for use!

This is more than only freight forwarding, this is passion and friendship!

For me it's very important that people know we have people in the group who are working with heart and support and not only focused on money!

Potosi **Cement Plant Project Inception in Bolivia**

X2 Logistics Networks member ALTIUS S.A. preformed unloading operations of the first vessel carrying breakbulk cargo for the construction of the Potosi Cement Plant, a new project in Bolivia.

The operation was carried out at Arica Port (Chile) using shore tension equipment. Cargo was

unloaded from vessel by shore cranes, moved to the laydown area and finally unloaded and stowed using reach stackers and shore cranes. Then once loaded, awaiting land transportation vehicles moved the pieces across Chile and Bolivia, which entailed following a greatly challenging route that included stretches of









road 4,680 meters above sea level with sharp bends. During unloading operations, an ALTIUS engineer surveyed operations and labelled each item with a project code to allow for better coordination between all parties involved in the project.







Shanghai Beetle Moves Machinery

X2 Projects member Shanghai Beetle Supply Chain Management Co., Ltd. successfully moved multiple shipments of heavy industrial equipment.

Their March 14th shipment from Shanghai, China to Gothenburg, Sweden saw Shanghai Beetle Supply Chain Management moved the machinery to vessel





side and also arranged the ocean freight transport by Maersk. The cargo was 1 piece of equipment measuring 13.9 x 3.66 x 4.1 metres and weighing 41,400 kilograms. About a month ago a break bulk shipment from Shanghai, China to Hai Phong, Vietnam was handled during Chinese New Year. Due tot he timing of the shipment coinciding with Chinese New Year the shipment was more challenging because the port was heavily congested and on top of that there was a shortage of truckers because most were at home celebrating the Chinese New Year with their families. The break bulk shipment measured 15 x 4.14 x 4.3 metres and weight 80,000 kilograms.

USA To Italy - X2 Members Viamar & **Transatlantic**

Recently, two X2 Elite members, Viamar SRL and Transttlantic North America Inc. worked together on a shipment of industrial equipment from the USA to Italy.

The cargo: Cabinet foaming fixture with hydraulic pump and control panel is an experimental piece and was being returned to Italy. The total weight of the shipment is 13,670 pounds.

Although the actual process of the shipment itself went smoothly, Mother Nature did shake things up a bit. Shortly after the equipment was loaded the weather along the US East Coast became a concern. Temperatures plunged and formed what has come to be known a Bomb Cyclone. A Bomb Cyclone is essentially a cold weather hurricane. Definitely not the best of conditions for almost anything.

In the end, the shipment arrived safely back home in Italy.









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X2, and based in Antwerp has provided logistics and chartering services for a project from Novorossiysk, Russia to Dammam, Saudi Arabia serving the oil & gas industry .

The cargo consisted of 5000 loose seamless pipes with an average length of 13 m and total weight of 9700 tons. Robema arranged a "part charter" to perform this voyage.

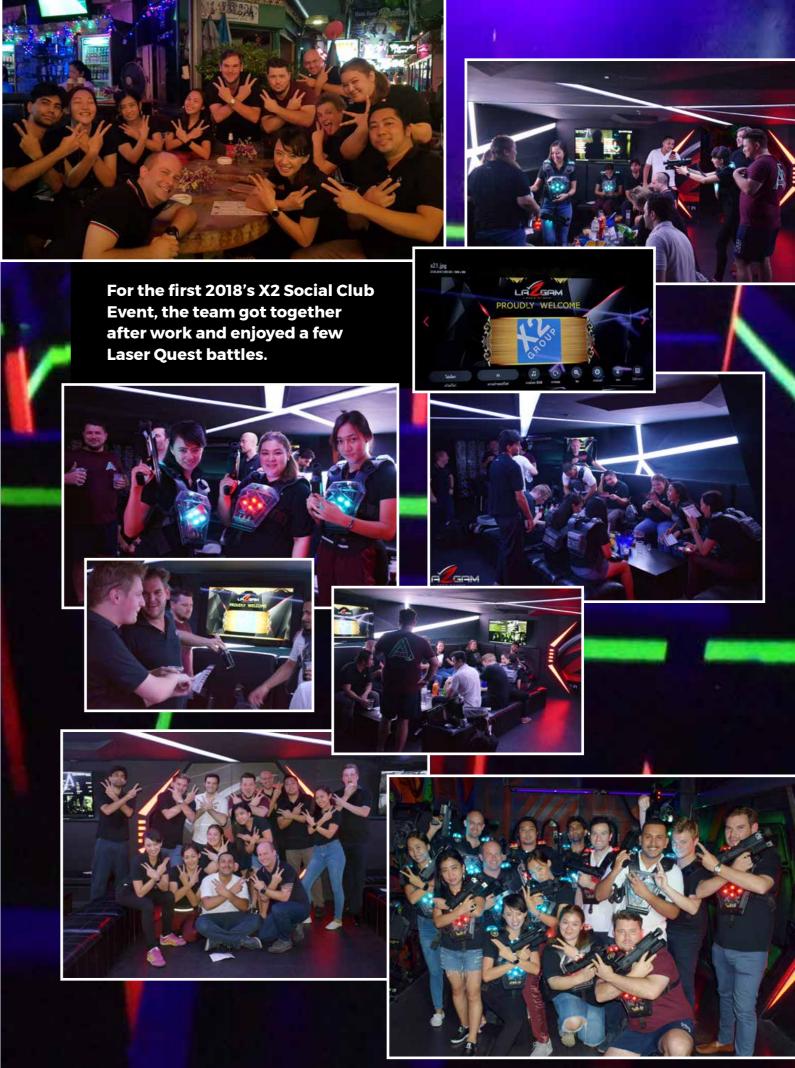

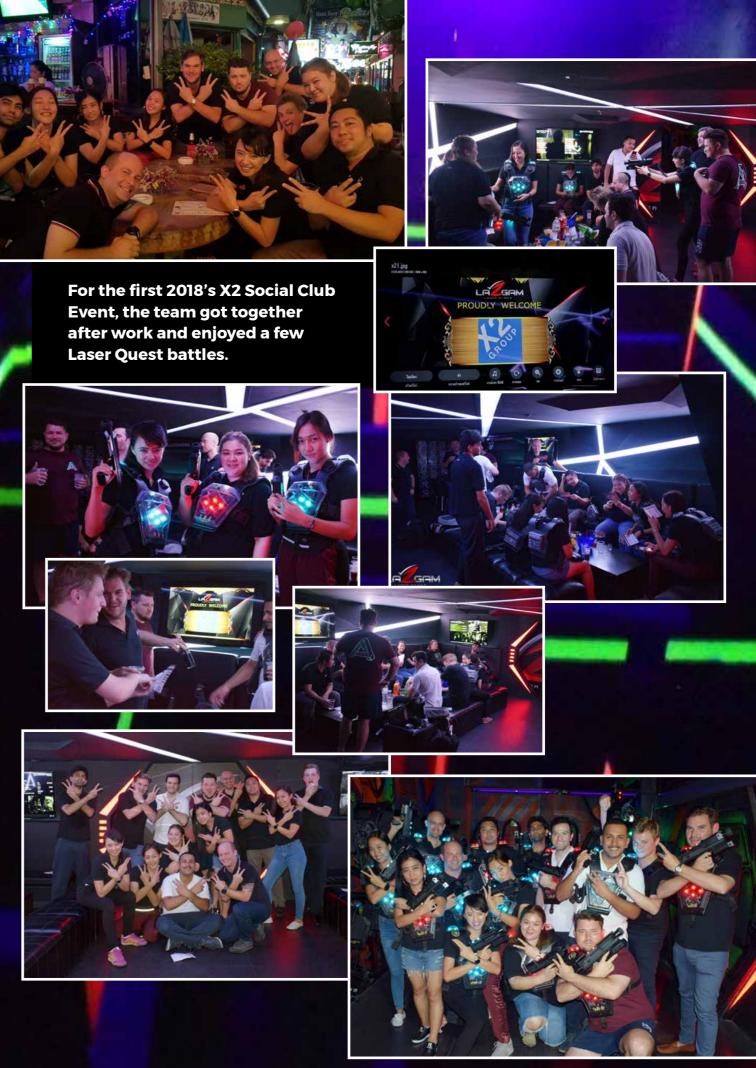


Murray & George Meet Panda Logistics
